Jubilee Fountain, Chart Way



This drinking fountain was originally in the Carfax to commemorate Queen Victoria's 1897 Diamond Jubilee.

Soon after the second World War the fountain was put into store, as it had become a traffic hazard.

In 1977 it was placed in Copnall Way to commemorate Queen Elizabeth II's Silver Jubilee.

It finally moved to here in 1993.



Climb the steps to the fountain and find the metal flowers that the drinking water used to come out of.

On your way to Horsham Park find where horses used to drink.

Piries Place

William Pirie was Headmaster of Collyer's School from 1822-1868. He used to travel around Horsham in his donkey and cart.



Find his life-size statue.

Find the donkey's name.

William Pirie built fifteen cottages on this site. Later on it was used as the location for Horsham Market, and then for a shopping precinct. This was named after him - Pirie's Place. In 2019 it was redeveloped again.

Inscribed on the harness is the donkey's name and when it was 'born'.
